

### **Road Safety Reminder**

We are increasingly noticing that students are being dropped on the Southern side of Moules road and not using the crossing lights. We ask that students who are dropped on the southern side of Moules road walk up to the crossing and cross at the lights. The crossing is monitored by a teacher on yard duty before and after school.

A 'kiss and drop' zone is located on the northern side of Moules road in front of the soccer pitch for parents driving up Moules road from St Bernard's Road.
