## Launch of Stretch Program

At Morialta Secondary College we take great pride in knowing our students and identifying the level of challenge and support they need. We know from our data and relationships with students and families that a significant number of our students need intellectual challenge and enrichment with their learning.

This term our Stretch program has included a STEM workshop with our Aija Mee investigating chance and probability and stretching students' their learning in Mathematics this term, as well as a Liberal Arts workshop with Tanja Gehren challenging students to draw comparisons develop analytical skills and effectively communicate their understandings. Thank you to all our parents and caregivers who have signed up to our Daymap Parent Portal. This term we have focussed on making learning activities and assessments visible to families along with assessment results and attendance information. Students are to be accommodated with homestay families in single or double placements.
