

Sport

This term has been action-packed with a series of impressive sporting achievements from our students. Kicking off the term, our Year 7/8 boys' football team embarked on a challenging journey to Mount Barker in Week 3. Despite a narrow loss to Mount Barker High School, our team demonstrated resilience and skill, securing victories against both Oakbank and Birdwood. Their performance reflects their hard work and dedication, setting a strong foundation for future games.

MSC also made a significant impact at the SA Volleyball Schools Cup, with six teams representing our school in the state's largest volleyball tournament. With nearly 1,500 students competing across six venues, our teams faced tough competition. Our Year 8 Girls team showed great determination, finishing 5th, while the Year 8 Boys secured 7th place. The Year 7 Girls teams both competed fiercely, with one team proudly earning the Bronze medal and the other finishing just behind in 4th place. The Year 7 Boys also had an outstanding run, with one team narrowly missing out on the gold, finishing 2nd, and the other putting up a strong fight for 4th place after a tough match against Brighton Secondary School.

These achievements highlight the strength of our sports program and the dedication of our students and staff.













Science Week

The theme of Science week this year (August 10-18) has been "Species survival – More than just sustainability". Students and teachers engaged their scientific skillsets to explore biodiversity, endangered species and changing populations through both in-class and optional extra activities. Students participated in practical activities, escape rooms, a lunchtime codebreaking challenge and the national science week quiz. Daily quizzes were popular throughout the week, with year 8 student Yashva answering the highest number of questions correctly and demonstrating the strongest knowledge about biology. Congratulations to the students from Blue who scored the most correct quiz responses across the week.




