Assessment at Morialta Secondary College

At Morialta Secondary College, assessment underpins quality learning experiences and purposeful teaching. Our approach to assessment is designed to empower students, helping them understand their progress, take ownership of their learning, and set ambitious goals for growth. Through thoughtful feedback, students gain the clarity and confidence needed to take their next steps.

For our teachers, assessment provides valuable insights into how students are progressing and what they need to succeed. This evidence helps refine teaching strategies, ensure learning experiences are tailored to student needs, and foster collaboration between educators to maintain consistent and high-quality practices across the college.

Students engage in two key types of assessment:

- Ongoing evidence of learning provides opportunities for students to demonstrate their understanding and receive feedback to guide their progress.
- **Graded evidence of learning** is used to evaluate a student's achievement at specific points and contribute to the semester report.

Families can view their child's assessment tasks, grades, and feedback throughout the year on **Daymap**. If your child is struggling in their learning or to keep up with assessment requirements, you and your child will be notified by a "learning check-in" email outlining the strategies and agreements in place to support them in the specific learning or task.

Homework Expectations

Homework supports students in reinforcing key learning, practicing skills, and developing independent study habits. At Morialta Secondary College:

- Year 7–9 students can expect up to a maximum of 1 hour of homework per night.
- Homework for individual subjects is set over a minimum of two nights to accommodate family schedules and extracurricular activities.
- Students should read for 15 to 20 minutes at least three times per week.

Homework tasks are recorded on **Daymap**, including due dates and instructions.
