- Thank you to everyone who participated in our 2026 Community Timetable feedback process. Your insights are invaluable and will guide our staff in finalising the timetable next term. We will share the final model in preparation for 2026.

Thank you to all staff and students for smoothly navigating the semester changeover. Our Year 9 students are now experiencing their second group of elective subjects, broadening their learning experiences. It has been terrific to see the breadth of year 9 electives come to life over the course of semester 1.
